**General Obligation Bond and**

**ESPLOST Election**

Shall the Long County School District issue general obligation bonds in principal amount not to exceed \$8,000,000 to pay the costs of (a) acquiring, constructing, and equipping a new Elementary School; (b) expansion and renovations to Long County Primary School; (c) system-wide renovations and improvements and adding to, remodeling, renovating, improving, and equipping existing educational buildings, properties, and facilities of the School District, and acquiring any property, both real and personal, and equipment necessary therefor, including technology equipment; and (d) financing the costs of issuance of such bonds including capitalized interest, AND shall a one percent sales and use tax for educational purposes be reimposed in Long County for a period of time not to exceed 20 consecutive calendar quarters commencing upon the termination of the one percent sales and use tax for educational purposes presently in effect for the raising of not more than [\$9,500,000] for the purpose of funding the payment of (a) a portion of the principal and interest on the above described general obligation bonds, (b) [retiring general obligation debt of the Long County School District previously incurred with respect to capital outlay projects, and (c)] a portion of the costs of the above described capital outlay projects not paid for with proceeds from said general obligation bonds?
